Dementia - Fifty million people are currently diagnosed. Estimated 82 million by 2030 (WHO, 2017).

Animal Assisted Therapy - Human and animal bond promotes improvement in emotional, social, physical well-being (Kaminski, Pellino, & Wish, 2007).

Community Volunteering - There is a positive relationship between late-life volunteering and health (Tang, Choi, & Morrow-Howell, 2010).

Participants

Residential Volunteers - From Independent Living, had well behaved dogs, and consented/committed to one hour per week.

Residential Participants - Lived in Early Memory Support Unit with diagnosis of dementia. CNA/floor staffing guided me towards appropriate residents. Verbal consents per visit.


Portraitures

Portraiture is a method to organize qualitative findings and paints a picture through words to describe meaningful experience that is captured within context and through the lens of the person. The portraitures were written by use of observation, conversations with volunteers, and the program's post-survey to display their experience in the Pet Pals Program.



Maggie's





She stated, "I hope people with problems will experience Charlie's love because of the way he acts and accepts them, and that will make their day better."

"I meet more people because of Charlie."

Schatzi fills me with joy and fellowship, follows me everywhere. He partially fills the big hole and emptiness left behind when my wife died. My apartment would be desolate and lonely without him."

He replied "They see that the animal loves them and does not judge them, their hearts are filled with love and joy in return. It gives me joy too."

He stated "enjoys seeing pets, owners, and patients all happily engaging."

She loves to "bring joy to peoples' faces, smiles and laughter in their voices and faces"

She is "eager to continue the program and create relationships with the residents."

She says, "Teddy brings her joy to her life every day and is very happy to share that with other residents."
